Raymond's credits include *Old Joy*, *Meek's Cutoff*, *Night Moves*, and *Wendy and Lucy*, a movie based on the short story "Train Choir" from *Livability*. He earned an Emmy Award nomination for his work on the 2011 HBO miniseries *Mildred Pierce*. He lives in Portland with his family.
